

- DO Know your Audience
- DO Design FOR Your Audience


- DO use an Original **Template**
- DO consider using Textures as Backgrounds
- DO Choose No More than 5 colors and 1 Accent Color
- DO use a Color or Theme that Reflects the Tone
- DO use a Font that Matches Your Theme and Tone
- DO use a Bold Title and **Opening Slide**



- DO use Visuals
- DO take Advantage of White Space
- DO convey One Main Idea Per Slide • DO use Layering to Include
- More than One Idea Per Slide DO use the Same Layout for Slides that Have the
- DO use Icons as Visual Cues

- DO NOT USE Transitions
- DO NOT USE Animation (unless they are purposeful)






DO use Symbols

DO be Consistent


DO use Size for Emphasis

DO use a Sans Serif Font

DO break Up Bullet Points in to Separate Slides

DO use Less than 15 words per slide


- DO use No More than 6 lines of text and No Sentences DO use No More than 3 Typefaces
- DO let Quotes Stand on Their Own
- DO use Metaphors • DO Double Check Grammar and Spelling
- Do make sure Font is Legible DO NOT USE Display Fonts for Body Copy
